What do the words 'nervous' and 'tentatively' suggest about the mood of the section of the story below?

The roar of a crowd was coming from inside the open doorway. A little nervous, Rory and the team tentatively made their way towards the noise...and walked inside. The noise rose as they stepped into a completely new surrounding...it appeared to be the Olympic Stadium!

- Which word on Page 3 tells you that Rory was excited to get started with the School Games 'Spirit of the Games' experience?
- Find one word in the text on Page 10 which means 'consideration' or 'dignity'.
- Find a word on Page 11 which suggests that the team are looking forward to the final challenge, and are less nervous about what might be behind the final door.
- The writer uses words like 'brilliant' and 'fantastic' on Page 9 to describe the skills the team showed in the boccia competition. What does this tell you about the characters?
- What other words or phrases could the author have used to describe how well the characters performed in the boccia competition?

- On Page 1, how can you tell that Mrs Robb is excited about the visitor arriving?
- What voice might the characters use?
- What was Carly thinking on Page 9, when she was watching the umpire measure the boccia ball distance on the last throw of the game?
- Why might the writer have decided to make the blue team win the boccia competition on Page 9 and not Rory's team?
- How do you feel about Rory pulling the team together for a group huddle after the first volleyball match on Page 12?
- 6 Can you explain why he might have done this?





- Look at the book's cover: what do you think this story is going to be about? What makes you think this?
- 2 Do you think the choice of setting will influence how the plot develops?
- Why did the author choose this setting?
- 4 Can you think of a story with the same theme?
- 5 Are any of the characters like someone you know? How?
- 6 What other stories have openings like this?
